Role summary:

We are looking to recruit a producer to work across a range of projects and with some of our supported freelance artists and companies. These may include offering some hours to our Sprngboard companies and freelance artists/communities as part of our Coventry City of Culture programme. There will also be an additional focus on a string of work as part of our South Asian programming.

As a role that is being funded by Belgrade Theatre's Garfield Weston funding, the objective is to provide producing support to freelance artists, companies and additional projects as a means to free space for them to dedicate more time to their artistic output. The objective is that this Producer is funded for the first 6 months with the hope to apply for funding or dovetail a further opportunity to continue as a producer in some capacity. It is therefore essential that those who apply are looking for a longer-term role supporting artists and companies in the West Midlands, and they can commit the minimum of 2 days per week with some flexibility around projects.

As part of their role, the Producer will also work with our comms team to capture their journey throughout for both evaluative and learning purposes and to share publicly.

Belgrade Theatre is adopting recommendations and action points contained in the More Than A Moment movement and as part of our commitment to creating a more inclusive and representative industry, we are inviting those from underrepresented groups to apply.

About Maokwo: Supporting Marginalised groups, refugees, asylum seekers and migrants artists. Engaging Communities using Art as a Vehicle

Maokwo supports, promotes and celebrates communities on the margins, addressing issues minoritised artists and communities face, and challenging the current status quo to build a more inclusive, democratic arts sector. With strong and ongoing connections with communities across Coventry, we have developed positive relationships and pools of artists and audiences including Maokwo Fusion Artist Network. We use art as a tool for positive change and creative activism. We work across the age ranging from 11 years old upwards Maokwo has been officially operating since 2017. Working in communities since 2007. We have been successful with funding and partnerships including Coventry City of Culture Trust, Heart of England, Counterpoint Arts and the Coventry Refugee and Migrant Centre, Belgrade theatre, Herbert art Gallery to mention a few. We have recently received our first ACE funding bid to create a pioneering Black Futures event in partnership with Belgrade Theatre, composed of three strands – a performance, an exhibition and a participatory programme - in October 2020, testing new ways to share visual art and performance with audiences. This is the first phase towards building. Maokwo has been a Belgrade theatre Springboard company since 2019-2022.
