

Welcome to this performance of **Nothello**, the last piece in our programme of work for Coventry UK City of Culture 2021.

Nothello is directed by Justine Themen, our Co-Artistic Director for 2021. Justine has been with the Belgrade for 18 years, formerly our Deputy Artistic Director and before that Associate Director, and has pioneered the Belgrade's practice of co-creating work with Coventry's communities. We'd like to thank Justine for her passion and hard work over the last 18 years and we wish her the very best in her new ventures.

Nothello is an absurdist, anarchic, insightful and witty new play from playwright Mojisola Adebayo. The increasingly meta deep-dive into Shakespeare's Othello is told from the perspective of Othello and Desdemona's unborn twins, Nothello and Desdeknownow. Join us as we imagine a version of Othello for today, where it's not a tragedy anymore, but a romance. Where Othello and Desdemona can start all over again – full of love and possibility, hope and wonder.

This show explores Othello's legacy and what it means to be of mixed heritage, working with a community company of interracial couples and people of mixed heritage.

Although we're about to say goodbye to Coventry's year as City of Culture, we're looking ahead to a summer of shows celebrating the legacy of the last 12 months. Our B2 stage will play host to remounts of two local plays which made their world premiere in summer 2021; **May Queen** and **The Allesley Silas**. **May Queen** follows sixteen-year-old Leigh as she is crowned Coventry's May Queen on a hot summer day, and will once again be directed by our Co-Artistic Director for 2021, Balisha Karra. **The Allesley Silas** comes from the pen of Coventry playwright and Vice Chairman of the Belgrade's Board, Alan Pollock, and retells George Eliot's beloved story of Silas Marner.

From September onwards, we welcome an incredible Autumn Season with highlights like West End hit musicals SIX, Beautiful: The Carole King Musical, and The Rocky Horror Show, classic drama An Inspector Calls and The Mousetrap, plus the world premiere of the brand new musical Bombay Superstar, co-produced by the Belgrade and Phizzical (Stardust, Bring on the Bollywood).

Beyond this, we look forward to more ground-breaking, co-created new work in the B2 as we shape our plans for the future.






GABRIEL AKAMO Othello/Otis

(Pitlochry Festival Theatre).

JUSTINE THEMEN Director

Justine Themen is the outgoing Deputy Artistic Director of the Belgrade Theatre and was Co-Artistic Director for its City of Culture 2021 programme. She played a key role in the winning of the City of Culture title for Coventry, and directed **Coventry Moves**, its opening event, the first large-scale outdoor event in the UK as the country emerged from the second wave of the global pandemic. She is currently Leadership Associate at The Royal Shakespeare Company.

She is a Theatre Director and Change Maker committed to placing an integrated approach to artistic excellence & creative engagement at the beating heart of contemporary theatre. Her work around diversity, community engagement and new work, has driven the agenda for the Belgrade Theatre's organisational change programme, Keys, and its new vision for a regional theatre for all; as well as influencing Coventry City of Culture's co-created approach to programming.

Her directing work spans a broad range of forms/contexts - from large-scale outdoor performances such as Coventry Moves (Coventry UK City of Culture 2021); to radio drama including This Little Relic (BBC Radio 3, 2021); from new writing from the UK's diverse communities Under the Umbrella by Amy Ng (Belgrade Theatre 2019), to innovative work with young people Like There's No Tomorrow (Belgrade Young Company/NT Connections commission, 2019 - published by Bloomsbury).

Prior to working at the Belgrade, she worked for 6 years in Suriname (the country her grandfather left for England in the late 1920s), co-creating theatre and using the Arts as a tool in Development & Cultural Diplomacy. She delivered projects for the Ministry of Education (Directorate of Culture), the Dutch Embassy & Arts Council and various UN organisations, as well as working closely with grass roots voluntary organisations, particularly in the rain-forested interior of the country.

She is a Fellow of the Clore Leadership Programme and sits on the Board of the Birmingham Opera Company. Justine has a BA in Drama and English from Bristol University, and an MA in Women's Studies from the University of Warwick.



MOJISOLA ADEBAYO Writer

Mojisola Adebayo is a playwright, performer, director, producer, workshop facilitator, mentor and lecturer. She holds a BA in Drama and Theatre Arts, an MA in Physical Theatre and a PhD in black queer theatre (Goldsmiths, Royal Holloway and Queen Mary, University of London). Mojisola trained extensively with Augusto Boal and is a specialist in Theatre of the Oppressed. She has worked in theatre, radio and television, on four continents, over the past 25 years, performing in over 50 productions, writing, devising and directing over 30 plays, from Antarctica to Zimbabwe.

Mojisola's plays include Moj of the Antarctic: An African Odyssey (Lyric Hammersmith and Ovalhouse, London); Muhammad Ali and Me (Ovalhouse, Albany Theatre, London and touring England); 48 Minutes for Palestine (Ashtar Theatre and international touring); Desert Boy (Albany Theatre, London and tour); The Listeners (Pegasus Theatre, Oxford); I Stand Corrected (Artscape, Ovalhouse, London and international tour); The Interrogation of Sandra Bland (Bush Theatre, London); Wind / Rush Generation(s) (National Theatre - Connections) and Nothello (Belgrade Theatre Coventry). Her latest plays, STARS (Tamasha Theatre and ICA) and also the Alfred Fagon award-winning play Family Tree (Actors Touring Company) open in Spring 2023.

Mojisola is a Fellow of the Royal Society of Literature, an Associate Artist with various organizations including Pan Arts, Building the Anti-Racist Classroom Collective, AICRE and Black Lives, Black Words, a Visiting Artist at Goldsmiths, University of London and Rose Bruford College, where she is also an Honorary Fellow. Mojisola is also a Lecturer at Queen Mary, University of London and a Research Fellow at University Potsdam. Mojisola is currently a commissioned artists with Counterpoints and will soon start as a Writer-on-attachment with the National Theatre.

Ola Animashawun is a National Theatre Associate and Connections Dramaturg and the co-founder and Creative Director of the playwriting consultancy, Euphoric Ink. He is also a former Associate Director of the Royal Court Theatre, where he worked for 23 years, during which time he founded and ran the Royal Court Young Writers Programme, and set up a nationwide writers' programme – Critical Mass – which is dedicated to finding and nurturing new playwrights from the Global Majority.

Ola has worked in theatre for over 30 years, with 20 of those years dedicated to specialising in script development as a dramaturg and facilitator. He has also held positions as an Associate Artist, Dramaturg and Mentor for Belgrade Theatre, Cheltenham Everyman Theatre, Theatre Absolute, Shop Front Theatre, and Eclipse Theatre. His other skills include acting, directing, devising, writing and presenting. He is a patron of Graeae Theatre and Script Yorkshire and an Honorary Fellow of the Royal Central School of Speech and Drama. He is also an Alfred Fagon Black Champion of Theatre.

VICTORIA WILLIAMS

Voice Coach

Victoria Williams has worked for the last twelve years as an Associate Voice Practitioner with the Royal Shakespeare Company and in West End theatre on Matilda the Musical since it began in Stratford-upon-Avon moving with the show to the West End in 2012. She continues to coach voices and teaches both adults and children to use their voices effectively, both in business and on stage. Victoria's specialism is on speaking Shakespeare and classical theatre in the open air and she has run many Voice in the Open Air workshops and Shakespeare and Voice workshops for the Royal Shakespeare Company and The Minack theatre.

Victoria has directed 100s of full scale children's productions and open air festivals over the last twenty five years though her youth theatre company Gobstoppers Theatre Arts, which she runs from her studio in Berkhamsted. She has also worked on countless projects and shows for the RSC at the following theatres: Associate Voice and text coach on Royal Shakespeare Company open stages programme, Pericles' (RSC The Courtyard Theatre); Stratford Upon Avon, Voice and text coach on Henry V (The Duchess Theatre West End); RSC open stages Voice and Shakespeare Workshops (Theatre Royal Norwich); The Hall for Cornwall; The Grand Theatre Blackpool; The Sherman Theatre Cardiff; The Gaiety Theatre The Isle of Man and at the Theatre Royal Bath and The National Student drama Festival.



JOELLE IKWA Assistant Director

Joelle is delighted to be Assistant Directing **Nothello**, an absurdist piece of theatre which brings together professional, youth and community practises. It is a play exploring interracial relationships, what it means to be of mixed heritage and deconstructing Shakespeare's famous Othello. Her involvement with **Nothello** has been working with the youth and community groups. As one of the first groups introduced to **Nothello**, she found it a joy to explore the different themes even from the first treatment. The youth and community groups have come together to devise some of the songs for the play, based on the themes of being mixed heritage.

She has found the process enjoyable and educational. It has challenged her personal thoughts and allowed her to become more knowledgeable about experiences of both interracial couples and people of mixed heritage. She encourages everyone to come and see the show, as it's the perfect way to end the City of Culture year at the Belgrade Theatre. This is a play for everyone, and a story that will keep you laughing and also thinking at the same time.

ARUN GHOSH

Composer & Sound Designer

Arun Ghosh is a British-Asian musician, composer and music educator. Twice awarded 'Jazz Instrumentalist of the Year' at the Parliamentary Jazz Awards, Arun leads his own ensembles, touring nationally and internationally. A renowned clarinettist and bandleader, he has released five albums on camoci records:

Northern Namaste, Primal Odyssey, A South Asian Suite and But Where Are You Really From?

His latest album, **Seclused in Light**, was released in March this year, with an accompanying national tour. A new work for chamber ensemble and voice, **The Canticle of the Sun**, is a Spiritual Jazz setting of St. Francis of Assisi's stunning paean to nature, the cosmos and the elements. Commissioned by Sound UK and Norwich and Norfolk Festival, the piece will tour churches, cathedrals and other sacred spaces from Summer this year. As a composer for theatre, Arun has contributed scores and sound designs to over a hundred productions since his debut in 2002; **Storm by Lemn Sissay** (Contact, Manchester).



Nothello is Arun's sixth production for Belgrade Theatre, having previously composed scores for Blood; Made in India (with Tamasha); Red Snapper; Under the Umbrella and the large-scale, site specific community project, CET. Other theatre work includes: The Bone Sparrow and Noughts & Crosses (Pilot Theatre); The Wolf, The Duck and The Mouse (Unicorn/New Perspectives); A Doll's House (Lyric Theatre, Hammersmith); Bystanders (Cardboard Citizens); Hobson's Choice, The Tempest, Antigone, Volpone (Royal Exchange, Manchester); Approaching Empty (Tamasha/Kiln Theatre); Much Ado About Nothing (Watford Palace Theatre) and Lions and Tigers (Shakespeare's Globe Theatre). Arun Ghosh is a Creative Associate at Watford Palace Theatre, and an Associate Artist of Z-arts, Manchester.
