She has worked in America, Europe, Africa, Australia and in many theatres around the UK including The National Theatre and has just finished performing in Jane Austen's **Mansfield Park** on tour and at Watermill Theatre.

Anni works regularly as a Theatre Director. She currently lectures on Drama and directs at St. Mary's University in Twickenham, Rose Bruford College of Speech and Drama, Royal Central College and at Royal Academy of Dramatic Arts. Her poems and short stories are published in various anthologies. *Empty Cradle* is published in the anthology *Secret and Silent Tears* and three of her poems are in another anthology *Wild Imperfections*, published by Penguin in November 2021. An extract from her novel **Breaking the Maafa Chain** won the Myriad Editions First Novel competition in 2018 and is featured in the *New Daughters of Africa* (2019) anthology edited by Margaret Busby.

Her first screenplay, **Blessed Assurance** has just been filmed and will be out later this year. Her debut novel, **Breaking the Maafa Chain**, was published in September 2021, by Jacaranda Books, UK and by Pegasus Books, USA in 2022 and in Brazil 2024 (translated into Portuguese). Anni is now working on her second novel **Ominira** as part of her PhD at King College London.

WRITER

Siana Bangura is a writer, producer, performer, campaigner and community organiser hailing from South East London, now living, working, and creating between London and the West Midlands. She is the founder and former editor of Black British Feminist platform, No Fly on the WALL; author of poetry collection, 'Elephant'; and the producer of **1500 & Counting**, a documentary film investigating deaths in custody and police brutality in the UK. Siana is also the founder of Courageous Films and Siana Bangura Productions and co-founder and co-curator of the Sierra Leone Arts & Culture Festival (SLACfest).

Siana works and campaigns on issues of race, class, and gender and their intersections and is currently working on projects focusing on climate change, the arms trade, Tech Justice, and state violence. As a playwright, Siana's recent works include the plays **Layila!** 2019 and **Swim, Aunty, Swim!** 2024, produced by Belgrade Theatre in association with tiata fahodzi. Her short films include **Denim** 2017. Siana is the co-host of 'Behind the Curtains' podcast, produced in partnership with English Touring Theatre (ETT) and host of 'People Not War' podcast, produced in partnership with Campaign Against Arms Trade (CAAT), where she was formerly a campaigner and co-ordinator.

With three TED Talks to her name, and experience in indie publishing, journalism, campaigns and comms under her belt, Siana's mission across her vast portfolio of work is to help move voices and experiences traditionally marginalised, from the margins, to the centre.



CLAIRE WINFIELD SET DESIGNER

Claire Winfield has been at the Belgrade for eight years, first as deputy, and currently as Head of Paint shop for Belgrade Theatre Scenery. This is her second design on stage at the Belgrade Theatre. Her first design was fort **Big Aunty** 2023.

She has previously worked as the resident designer and painter for Harrow School, and a scenic artist for Hornchurch and Nottingham Playhouse.

NAOMI THOMPSON

COSTUME DESIGNER

Naomi is currently Wardrobe Supervisor at Belgrade Theatre. She studied fashion and textiles in Birmingham, Walsall and Nottingham. Upon graduating she interned as a costume maker in Venice, Italy.

DURAMANEY KAMARA

SOUND DESIGNER & COMPOSER

Duramaney Kamara was born into a family of afro-jazz musicians, becoming infatuated with instruments, live music and production from a young age. His childhood home was filled with reggae, jazz and afro-beat, which continue to influence his composition and music production to this day.

As a child Duramaney performed with his parents in gigs around London, developing a multi-disciplinary talent for playing instruments, his favourite being the trumpet. At six years old he began writing and producing songs on GarageBand and as a teenager was invited to create music in professional studios for artists around London.

Duramaney, aka 'D L K' is also a recording artist and producer who releases music under his indie label **Breaking Bread & Boundaries**, founded in 2018. He released his debut EP, **F*ck It Let's Move** in 2019, which peaked at #1 in the UK iTunes pre-order charts. He most recently co-produced two tracks on Mostack's latest album, **High Street Kid 2** which made it into the UK Top 40. D L K is set to release more of his own music.

Duramaney is also an actor. He had his stage debut in 2016 at the Almeida in Leo Butler's **Boy** and had his screen debut in 2018 in Idris Elba's feature film **Yardie**. He continues to work as an actor alongside composition and music production.

Chinonyerem Odimba is a Nigerian British playwright, screenwriter, and poet.

Her work for theatre includes: The Bird Woman of Lewisham at the Arcola, Rainy Season, and His Name is Ishmael for (Bristol Old Vic), Joanne for (Clean Break), and Amongst the Reeds for (Clean Break/The Yard Theatre), Twist for (Theatre Centre), Sweetness of a Sting for (National Theatre Connections), Medea at (Bristol Old Vic), We Too, Are Giants for (Kiln Theatre), Unknown Rivers at (Hampstead Theatre), Prince and the Pauper at (Watermill Theatre), The Seven Ages of Patience at (Kiln Theatre), Princess & The Hustler which toured across the UK for (Eclipse Theatre/Bristol Old Vic/Hull Truck).

More recently, Chinonyerem has written for Young Vic Theatre on the experimental Al play, (RSC)/Coventry City of Culture 2021 Faith, and is currently under commission with Kiln Theatre, RSC, and Manchester Royal Exchange.

She has been shortlisted for several awards including the Adrienne Benham and Alfred Fagon awards. In 2015 her unproduced play **Wild is De Wind** was shortlisted to the final ten for the Bruntwood Playwriting Award. She is the winner for the 2018 Sonia Friedman Award (Channel 4 Playwright Bursary) for a new play **How to Walk on the Moon**, and a finalist for the inaugural Women Playwriting Prize 2020 for her play Paradise Street.

In 2022, Chinonyerem won the WGGB Writer's Guild Award for Best Musical Bookwriting for her play **Black Love.**

Chinonyerem's TV credits includes **Scotch Bonnet** for BBC Three and **A Blues for Nia** for BBC/Eclipse Theatre, **Adulting** for Channel 4, and more recently **My Best Friend Married a Warrior** for CBBC.

In April 2021, Chinonyerem Odimba became the new Artistic Director and Chief Executive of tiata fahodzi.

As a director, Chinonyerem has worked for (Bristol Old Vic, Theatre503 and Bristol Old Vic Theatre School), as well as new drama **Braids** by Olivia Hannah for Live Theatre/BBC Radio 4.

GABRIELLE NIMO MOVEMENT DIRECTOR

She began her journey to Dramatherapy career on an acute NHS mental health ward for two years before returning to theatre and working in the community. The journey of Swim, Aunty, Swim! is a long, winding road, beginning in 2018 when Ama - in her leopard print swimsuit - and Blessing - in her glorious gele - first took their seats in my mind. The road stretches back to 2017, when Alex passed away and I chatted to his mum about swimming; as far back as 2015 when I started working on issues of deaths in custody and police brutality in the UK; as far back as 2010, when Ayo passed away, after swimming in the Amazon River... back to when I watched **Beyond the Blue** by Swim Dem Crew... back to all the things I've learnt about the power of water as a West African, from a country on the coast of the continent... so many different influences, rooted in grieving, pulled together through storytelling to make sense of it all. And as is characteristic of my work, my mission was to centre voices and experiences traditionally marginalised - on this occasion, celebrating the lives of our aunties.

There are many people to thank, but I want to especially thank Madeleine Kludje, Corey Campbell, and the late great Hannah Barker for being OG champions of this work - and of me. I want to thank my gorgeous cast and creative team for all their hard work and passion. And of course, the biggest thanks of all goes to my mama, Kadiatu Bangura, for whom, I do all things. Thank you for the love that guides and grounds me.

I hope you, the audience, love this piece of work. I have loved these characters for so many years, and I'm over the moon to finally share them with you too. May their journeys teach us all to trust the tides.

tiata fahodzi is the UK's leading British African heritage contemporary theatre company. tiata fahodzi produces theatre that is fearless for a Britain of today; rich with languages, races, cultures and identities. The company makes theatre that looks around and looks forward, with a mission to tell contemporary stories in modern and innovative ways, celebrating characters and audiences defined not by their diversity, but by their humanity.

tiata fahodzi is a theatre company that places the stories of British African heritage communities at its core and is committed to making ambitious theatre for mid-scale stages and building confidence in British African heritage artists to be formally experimental in their work.

Founded in September 1997 by playwright and director Femi Elufowoju Jr, since April 2021, has been under leadership of award-winning playwright and theatre director, **Chinonyerem Odimba** as tiata fahodzi's new Artistic Director/CEO.

In 2022, the company celebrated its 25th birthday with a season titled 'Year of the Artist' and was able to mark a new chapter in the Arts Council England National Portfolio Organisation's history by securing a further investment for 2023-26.

Previous work by tiata fahodzi includes **seeds** by Melanie Pennant, **good dog** by Arinzé Kene, **mixed brain** by Nathan Bryon, **bricks and pieces** by Charlene Janes, **iya ile (the first wife)** by Oladipo Agboluaje and **the gods are not to blame** by Bola Agbaje. More recently, the company has produced **Black Love** a new musical written and directed by Chinonyerem Odimba, and an inaugural triple bill of plays by Malaika Kegode, babirye bukilwa, and Diana Nneka Atuona called **Talking About a Revolution**, and in Autumn 2023 a debut play **cheeky little brown** by Nkenna Akunna.
