## What is Freedom to Reimagine?

*Freedom to Reimagine* is a three-day celebration where people come together to share stories, creativity, and ideas. It's a chance to see and experience work that has been created with young people, families, community members, and artists over the past few months.

The event also gives a first look at the journey toward our future stage production *Nanny of the Maroons* (2027), and includes work developed through our Media Academy, education programmes, and community projects.

## Who Was Nanny of the Maroons?

Nanny of the Maroons was an 18th-century freedom fighter, military leader, and spiritual figure who led communities of formerly enslaved Africans in Jamaica.

Nanny's legacy represents courage, leadership, and wisdom passed down through generations, and the fight for freedom. She is honoured as a National Hero of Jamaica, and her story continues to inspire us to think about how we have important conversations today; especially conversations about justice, leadership, resilience, and how we support one another.

Her story encourages us to think about freedom, imagination, and how communities can shape their own futures.

It offers practical insight into the world of freelancing, media careers and digital content production, as well as opportunities to work-shadow on professional productions.

## 19 Mar – The Schools and Communities Behind the Work

A platform for performance, conversation, and reflection. It highlights the creative and emotional contributions of young people from schools, colleges, and churches, centering their voices, stories, and experiences.

Through exploring ideas of freedom, power, storytelling, and collective strength, the young people have created original pieces in poetry, dance, and theatre. These performances are supported by newly created music, co-created with *Nanny of the Maroons* composer **CORAH FOWLES**.

Hosted by **DANIELA OLANREWAJU** a member of the Belgrade's *Creative Youth Forum* and **FEMI THEMEN**, a previous *Black Youth Theatre* member.

Femi is a British-Surinamese artist based in Coventry and London. Primarily working in sculpture and sound, her practice draws from a politic of waywardness to negotiate processes of social and personal grief.
